

Dr James Dalglish completed his medical degree at the university of Sydney as a post graduate student. Prior to his medical studies he completed a Bachelors of Science in molecular biotechnology. During medical school James was an active member of the student surgical society and maintained an interest in ophthalmology and global health. After leaving medical school with honours, James completed his internship and resident years in Sydney and Broken Hill. During these years James was able to travel to Myanmar with the Myanmar Eye Care Project to provide ophthalmic care to a population with one of the highest rates of blindness in the world.
