
Preparing your roof for the Rainy Season

What to look for;

- Loose or unsecured metal sheets or surrounding roofing components
- Any existing rust or damage

- Potential leaks from skylights. Look for water staining around the skylight edges
- Or any other indications that your roof may be at risk of leaking include moss or cracks to eaves lining

Clean your gutters

- Water needs somewhere to flow and now is the time to check your gutters and down pipes for any blockage or damage and give them a good cleanout.
- Remove leaves, branches, and any debris if safe to do so.

Trim back your trees.

- Overhanging branches can break in storms and cause damage to your house or surrounding powerlines making it very dangerous for you and your family.
- Take the time to assess your garden. If there are any signs of dead branches or large overhanging trees, trim them back.
