# A CHECKLIST OF THINGS TO DO

# 4 WEEKS TO GO

- · Collect family's dental and medical records, letters of introduction and children's records
- · If renting, advise your current landlord

# 3 WEEKS TO GO

- Advise your friends, relatives, solicitor, local council, insurance companies, accountant, hire purchase companies, stores where you have accounts, your church and clubs
- Start packing and labelling boxes with contents and intended location in your new home (if Allied Pickfords are not handling your packing)

## 2 WEEKS TO GO

- If moving a long distance, have your car serviced
- Arrange for pet transportation if necessary
- Advise your bank(s) where you have accounts, including credit cards

# 7 DAYS TO GO

- · Notify your post offi ce to redirect your mail
- · Arrange Electoral Roll transfer
- · Advise the Taxation Office

# 6 DAYS TO GO

- · Advise motor registry (your licence, motor vehicle registration etc)
- · List essential items you will need on moving day

# 5 DAYS TO GO

Ask your move consultant about our free utility connection service that can take care of the below.

- Contact your supplier regarding disconnection of your phone and fi nal billing. Confi rm new number and date of connection
- · Organise fi nal accounts for gas, water and electricity
- Ensure continuity of these services at your new address

#### 4 DAYS TO GO

- · Cancel local arrangements, for example, lawn mowing
- · Check with manufacturers whether your washing machine and refrigerator motors need bolting down for transport
- · Clean out medicine cabinet
- · Empty rubbish bins
- · Do final clear out of garage and unwanted furniture
- Empty steam iron, toaster, griller etc
- Get rid of inflammables (throw out or give to neighbours) / Drain fuel from lawnmower and other machinery

- · Wash and dry laundry
- Prepare any items requiring dismantling which are being moved, for example, trampolines, garden furniture, modular furniture etc.

#### 1 DAY TO GO

- · Tighten lid on all jars containing liquids
- · Dismantle TV aerial if taking it
- Defrost fridge and freezer and remove food. Wash out interior
- Separate items that belong to the house, eg, appliance instruction manuals, kitchen items, including roasting dishes and baking trays

# THE BIG DAY

You should be just about organised

- Consider packing a carton with essential things you will need when you first arrive, eg, bathroom effects, toilet paper, and basic kitchenware
- · Carry all valuables, cash and important papers with you
- · Tighten all taps
- · Turn off water heater and drain it
- · Check gas, electric switches and lights
- · Lock doors and windows and return house keys
- · Check nothing has been left behind

## A FEW DON'TS

- Don't store perishable foods such as cereal, flour, vegetables etc.
- If storing your household goods, the following articles are classifi ed as DANGEROUS GOODS and cannot be stored: ammunition, paint, linseed oil turpentine, kerosene, petrol, cleaning fl uids
- Don't have your furniture French polished just before moving, as it is extremely difficult to move without marking
- Don't put breakables or liquids in drawers. and don't overload drawers with too much linen or clothing
- Don't store jewellery, money, legal documents or articles of extreme value
- Don't leave travel tickets or passports where they might be packed
